

Second person in a day shot less than half a mile apart in Skunk City

Syracuse, N.Y. — A [second person](#) was reportedly shot in under half a mile apart in less than 24 hours in the city's Skunk City, according to dispatches.

A woman told 911 staff her stepfather was shot at 10:46 a.m. on Hartson Street, according to dispatches. The woman told dispatchers it happened outside of a house.

Police arrived and reported a man possibly shot in the stomach, according to dispatches. An ambulance responded to the call.

Police were seen standing outside 110 Hartson St. Nine police cars and a crime scene van lined the street.

The shooting happened less than half a mile from the 1300 block of West Onondaga Street, where a person was shot Saturday evening.

The person was inside an upstairs bedroom around 5:07 p.m. in the 1300 block of West Onondaga Street when a bullet punched through the building and hit the person in the upper body, according to dispatches.

Patrolling police officers heard multiple gunshots in the area before arriving, dispatchers said. The city's ShotSpotter system recorded eight rounds, they said.

Police said they found what appeared to be bullet holes in the home, according to dispatches.

A spokesperson for the Syracuse police did not respond to questions about either shooting.

According to Google Maps, the scenes are a five-minute walk apart.
