BALTIMORE — Two men died and another was injured overnight in shootings in Baltimore, city police said.

Police said a 38-year-old man died and a 21-year-old man was injured after they were shot just before midnight Sunday in northwest Baltimore. The victims were shot in the 3400 block of Lyndale Avenue, police said.

The 21-year-old victim, who was shot in the leg, was taken to the hospital for treatment. The other victim, identified as Darnell Poole, was taken to Sinai Hospital, where he

Two firearms were recovered at the scene, police said.

A man was fatally shot early Monday mornig in south Baltimore, police said.

Police said the shooting was reported around 1:15 a.m. Officers found the victim shot in a parking lot in the 2600 block of West Patapsco Avenue at Marbourne Avenue.

The victim was taken to Johns Hopkins Hospital, where he died, police said.


